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SYNOPSIS

Take Out is a day-in-the-life of Ming Ding, an illegal Chinese immigrant working as a deliveryman for a Chinese take-out shop in New York City. Ming is behind with his payments on his huge debt to the smugglers who brought him to the US. The collectors have given him until the end of the day to deliver the money that is due. After borrowing most from friends and relatives, Ming realizes that the remainder must come from the day's delivery tips. In order to do so, he must make more than double his average daily income.

In a social-realist style, the camera follows Ming on his deliveries throughout the upper Manhattan neighborhood where social and economic extremes exist side by side. Intercutting between Ming's deliveries and the daily routine of the restaurant, **Take Out** presents a harsh and realistic look at the daily lives of illegal Chinese immigrants in present day New York City.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

Take Out is a feature film shot on digital video due to both the cinema vérité style and the non-existent budget. Employing an ensemble cast of both professional and nonprofessional actors, and shooting in an actual take-out restaurant during operating hours without a crew provided filmmakers Tsou and Baker with a liberating experience in which acting and story became the only concern. The “run and gun” method of filmmaking created a raw energy that the filmmakers feel they have captured on film.

Taking cues from the filmmaking of Ken Loach and the Dardenne brothers, **Take Out** puts a distinctly human face on the lives of people largely hidden from and ignored by the mainstream.

THE CAST

Charles Jang - Ming Ding

Raised in New York, Charles is a first generation Korean-American. He began dabbling with the performing arts in high school improvisation workshops, staged skit performances, and nunchaku (martial arts) demonstrations. Although he initially chose a financial economics major in college, Charles continued attending acting classes and workshops. At the age of 20 he spent a year in Taiwan studying Mandarin (one of the requirements for the Ming Ding role). In 2001, Charles unexpectedly started working on film sets which led to looking at acting as more than a serious hobby. As of Summer 2003, he was admitted into the Screen Actors Guild. This is his first leading role.



Jeng-Hua Yu - Young

Born and raised in Taipei, Taiwan, Jeng-Hua received his BA in Drama and Cinema at the Chinese Cultural University in Taipei. He came to the states in 2001 to study Performing Arts at New York University. Take Out is Jeng-Hua's first feature film, having starred in numerous stage productions, commercials, and short films.



Wang-Thye Lee - Big Sister

Born and raised in Malaysia, Ms. Lee is the film's only nonprofessional in a major role. She has worked in a take-out for close to ten years. Fresh and incredibly appealing, Ms. Lee caught the eyes of Shih-Ching and Sean during the film's location scouting. She was immediately cast for the role of Big Sister.



Justin Wan - Wei

Justin was born and raised in Singapore. He has just graduated with a Master of Fine Arts at the University of New Orleans in May 2002, and was awarded the Marcus B. Christian scholarship by the dean of the Graduate School. Before he coming to the United States for his graduate work, Justin worked as an assistant producer with Television Corporation of Singapore. Besides writing and directing his own projects, he also dabbles onto acting whenever opportunities arise.



THE FILMMAKERS

Sean Baker - writer/director/producer/camera/editor

Sean was born and raised in the New York area and graduated NYU's Tisch School of the Arts where he studied film and television. He is one of the co-creators, co-directors and co-writers of **Greg the Bunny**, a comedy show that ran on both FOX and the IFC Channel.

Although, **Greg the Bunny** will be beginning its 5th incarnation in the Spring of 2008, Sean's long term goals lie in feature film making. He premiered his first feature, **Four Letter Words** at South By Southwest 2001. It is currently available on DVD through Vanguard Cinema. Since **Take Out**, Sean has directed a new film focusing on the illegal counterfeit goods business in Manhattan. It is entitled **Prince of Broadway** and is currently in post-production.



Shih-Ching Tsou - writer/director/producer/editor

Shih-Ching was born and raised in Taipei, Taiwan. After receiving a bachelor's degree in religious studies in Taiwan, Shih-Ching came to the states for her Masters in Media Studies at The New School. Her credits include production design on three nationally aired commercials and post-production work on three short films. Shih-Ching supports her indie film career as a graphic artist.
